Deborah: Biblical Judge, Prophet, and Warrior

led by Dr. Joy Schroeder, Prince of Peace member and professor of church history at Capital University, where she teaches at Trinity Lutheran Seminary in the Religion and Philosophy Department.

The biblical prophet Deborah was a judge, religious authority, and war leader whose story disturbed traditional assumptions about women's authority. Through the ages, some women and their supporters used the example of Deborah to argue that women may become pastors, rabbis, queens, political candidates – and even get the vote! Others objected that Deborah's example should not be followed by ordinary women. Dr. Schroeder will talk about how the scriptural account of Deborah has been used against women, for women, and by women who aspired to leadership roles in church, synagogue and society through the centuries. Joy Schroeder is the author of *Judging Deborah: Gender Politics and Biblical Interpretation* (Oxford University Press).

Immigrant Children Without a Country

There are approximately 900,000 to 1 million undocumented immigrant children who were brought to the US by their parents and have been assimilated into our society through our schools and culture. Having been here for several years, they are “Americanized Kids”.

Currently, there is no method for these children to obtain US citizenship and become productive adults. They are in fact subject to deportation to their countries of birth and in our current immigration climate are threatened by this possibility on a regular basis. This class will explore ways we can help to support them.

An ELCA Policy Statement

When the ELCA was formed in January 1988, a policy statement (“The Vision of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America”) was adopted that described the ELCA witness toward and with the entire church of Christ including other denominations and Christian traditions.

The new policy statement, considered for adoption at the ELCA church wide assembly in August 2019, extends the ELCA witness to all world religions as well as people that do not identify with any religion.
