The Caring Connections ministry is an outreach of the Parish Health Ministry and serves as an extension of the pastoral services from Prince of Peace. Caring Connections provides an opportunity for individuals and their families to remain connected to the church at a time when it may otherwise be difficult to do so.

Those who may benefit:

- New parents
- Widow/widower
- Homebound members
- Members living in an Assisted Living or Nursing Home facility
- Hospitalized
- Non-drivers
- Caregivers needing support

The Caring Connections Volunteer

is an established member of Prince of Peace and is a caring person with an interest in enriching the lives of others desiring a connection to Prince of Peace church. This is accomplished through various activities of concern and support.

Connecting activities may include:

- Conversation / Listening
- Presence
- Playing Games
- Reading
- Assistance with correspondence
- Watching TV
- Prayer
- Music therapy
- Delivery of altar flowers
- Caregiver respite
- Eucharist (Communion)
- Shopping or errands on behalf of the care receiver
- Minor household chores
- Providing meals following recent illness or hospitalization



For safety purposes, the Caring Connections volunteers *will not*:

- Provide personal care (bathing, toileting, massage, etc.)
- Perform any activity with which they're unfamiliar or that may result in harm or injury
- Dispense medications (prescription or over-the-counter)
- Provide medical advice
- Provide transportation through the Caring Connection Ministry
- Accept compensation

The needs of those who request the services of this ministry

will be assessed by the Caring Connections Coordinator, Barb Baker, RN who serves as the Parish Nurse for Prince of Peace. A care receiver will be matched with a volunteer who best meets the receiver's needs.
